Prairie Grove: #1 in Green Energy

Last year, the Prairie Grove Board of Trustees unanimously agreed to participate in a municipal energy aggregation program for the village's energy needs. The program allows villages to choose where their energy comes from - selecting between traditional sources and cost-effective, renewable, or 'green' energy sources. The Board felt that choosing green energy for our electricity needs reflected the value that our community places on the environment and our surroundings, making Prairie Grove an **Environmental Protection Agency** "Green Power Community."

The EPA ranks Green Power Communities across the whole country, and Prairie Grove just placed NUMBER ONE- the greenest community in the United States, measured by green power as a percent of total electricity use! EXCITING NEWS!!

The Village Board recently passed an ordinance allowing properly registered non-highway vehicles to be legally driven on certain streets throughout the Village of Prairie Grove from **May 1st through November 1st.**

The fee for new registrations is \$100 for the first year. Those owners renewing their same non-highway vehicle pay a \$50 renewal fee. Visit prairiegrove.org get a full copy of the local ordinance and a usage map regulating legal operation on Village streets.

After you submit an application, Police Department staff will contact applicants for the required vehicle inspection. Inspection location (your residence or the Police Department parking lot) will be determined by the inspecting officer once you are contacted. Please read the ordinance carefully so that you have all the required functional equipment needed to obtain a registration. You will also need to provide proof of vehicle insurance in accordance with the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code. Once the inspection is complete, registration stickers will be issued to the applicant upon payment. Payment can be presented in the form of a check at the time of inspection made payable to the Village of Prairie Grove. You may also pay online at prairiegrove.org with a credit card.

Are you a victim of Unemployment Insurance benefits fraud?

Like other agencies across the state, the Prairie Grove Police Department has seen a significant increase in unemployment insurance identity theft. If you receive a debit card or an Unemployment Insurance (UI) Funding Letter and did not file for unemployment benefits:

- Contact the police department to file a report.
- Report the fraudulent claim to the Illinois Department of Employment Security on their website of www2.illinois.gov/ides
- DO NOT activate the debit card that was mailed to you.
- Request your free credit reports via <u>www.annualcreditreport.com</u> and review the reports for other fraudulent activities

SPRING 2021 BRUSH PICKUP PROGRAM MAY 3rd & 4th



The Village will begin its spring brush pick-up program on May 3, 2021& May 4, 2021 for the entire village. All residents must have their brush out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on May 3rd. Crews will visit each street once and continue until they have gone through the entire Village. **No callbacks will be made.**

This program is for tree material only. This program is intended for larger tree branches resulting from trimming or storm damage and is for residential properties only. No stumps or roots will be taken. Branches should be no longer than 15 feet and no more than 5 inches in diameter. Residents are advised to place brush on the parkway parallel to the street but not in the street. If you have any questions, please call the Public Works Department
